Government Updates

- They have confirmed that they will return to similar grade boundaries to before the pandemic (2019)
- The government is also confirming that students should continue to be provided with support in GCSE mathematics, physics and combined science with formulae and equation sheets, but not with advance information of exam content, as was the case last year.

Attendance is key to success

- Students need to aim for 97% attendance
- Year 11 is only two full terms. Exams start in May.
- 90% attendance = losing half a day a week will drop GCSEs by 2 grades
- If attendance drops below 90%, students only have a 5% chance of getting 5 or more GCSEs.
- Support from home is key.
- Children who are supported by their parents are 15-17% more likely to be a higher achiever in maths and English, regardless of educational background

School **does not** shut at 15:00
Year 11 students always have work to do!

- Sessions run everyday Tuesday – Friday
- Regular messages home to update you when the sessions change
- We can always offer a quiet space to work

Practical Support at home

- Provide a quiet space to work and revise
- Support them in buying revision material
- Check Classcharts and ask them how they are getting on with their homework and revision
- Ask them to show you their revision
- Encourage them to use the school platforms discussed tonight

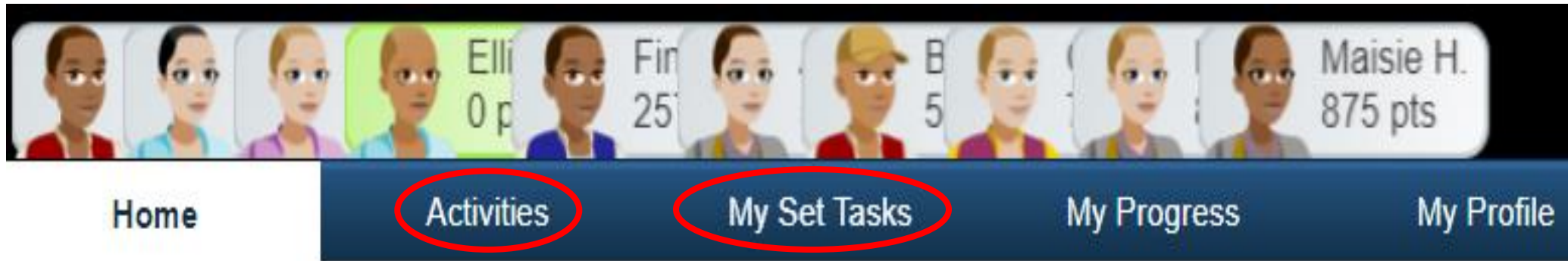

Your GCSE grades really do count!

To join Sixth Form you will need at least **5 GCSEs** at level 4 or above including English Language and Maths, in addition some subjects will have specific requirements.

Some A 'Level's have additional entry requirements:

Examples:

- Biology/Chemistry/Physics – You need a **5** in English and Maths and a **6** in Science
- Psychology – You need a **6** in English and a **5** in Maths and Science



The Medicine route

Must include Maths, English, Chemistry and Biology at grade 7
(or 6 GCSE's at grade 7 plus Maths and English at grade 6 = 8 GCSE's)

Do not accept GCSE resits
